I have written the two books mentioned and have another in edit plus two more business books in the planning stage.


Where is need your assistance and help is in the military aviation books. I want to offer your book "First over Germany, and Bob Denny's "Aces" as a product.

Enclosing a clip from the San Diego Union about the 1942 raid on Tokyo...the 50th anniversary of the group.

Had been thinking for sometime that perhaps someone like Andy Rooney for some network might want to have camera/video coverage of the 306th Reunion in England. Perhaps a tie to the "Memphis Belle" or similar footage. I have a vid-o of the air war from Africa to the air war onver Scheinfurt with the B-17's.

Has any plan along this line been in process. It would be of interest to our British friends too. Perhaps they could tie up with an American network and combine their coverage.


You can bet that hundreds, perhaps thousands of the final tape could be sold to all our members and the general public. Should there by someone in the Association who has this kind of background, it could be done completely under the control of the Association.. as Executive Producer and distributor.

Here in La Jolla, I have been the founder and chairman of what is known as La Jolla Concerts By The Sea...fifteen concerts almost every Sunday during the Summer. We are planning to work with a Cable firm to use their studios and equipment to tape almost all of our concerts, boil them down and have five to ten hours of music for which we would seek a commercial sponsor and run them on cable and perhaps a commervial network. We would make money to support continued concerts.

The Cable Company as a condition of their franchise with the City must cooperate and train community groups who wish to produce TV showings. So we are working on that to see what we can do. Maybe a cable network in other parts of the country have similar community requirements.

Received the new Echoes...well done..surprised to see the column about all of us writing our experiences for the family..hope it helps to get more history in your files (As if you don't have enough of a load now!).

Dear Ed:

Got your letter of 23 April today, I thought it deserved an immediate answer.

We have pursued a number of avenues in trying to get such coverage. We talked with Andy Rooney at Pittsburgh about it, and have had extensive correspondence with U. S. Networks, ABC, CBS, CNN and NBC. I doubt that any of them will really do very much, but we will keep after them. CNN was perhaps a bit more enthusiastic.

We have also contacted the news organizations in Britain, and they have shown more interest in participating.

We took a flier last fall on trying to get someone out of the Royal family to join our London banquet. No luck. The queen does not interrupt her vacation in Scotland for any thing; the Prince of Wales is busy, and Prince Andrew has other concerns.

Rooney and Charles Kuralt went to the '82 "do" at Thurleigh, and Andy has just been, or is presently in, England to participate in the 50th reunion of Stars and Stripes.

Our total number is up to about 260 registered at the moment, and the travel people say that it is taking one and one-half persons to handle the telephone inquiries they are getting.

I'm off to Seattle on the 10th of May to begin planning for the 1993 reunion there. So, I manage to keep busy--even stooping to mowing grass, weeding borders, etc., to keep the house manager happy. At least I attempt to keep her happy!

We are still working trying to get one of the news services, here or in England, to do some work on us. The 306th figures in a special being prepared in England for showing during this year there, and it may well make its way to the States. Both Don Ross and I were interviewed last summer in England for it, and I furnished them pictures, and they had a copy of our 1944 color film to use for clips.

We will circularize our group before leaving to discuss with people taking video cameras to give us copies of the footage, which may then be put together in some kind of a coherent look at the 306th in reunion.

We do not have \$10,000 to spend on such a venture, however.

I am enclosing a copy of the tape made at our Las Vegas reunion, which I am sure you will enjoy seeing. It includes the color film of the 306th, which we had put on video tape as the film was getting in bad shape--and which we didnot have ownership of. Thanks very much for your letter about possible video
taping of the Reunion in England.

Have been doing some checking that might help out:

1/ Talked with the News Director here, Channel 8 TV,
San Diego. Fellow named Bob Holtzman. He said if someone
shot the scenes using VHS tape, regular amatuer quality,
and shot it well that he could bump it up the 3/4 " tape
of broadcast quality and use it on the News. Said I
would probably be interviewed to give it local content
otherwise it wouldn't be of much interest.

Said they had neither the money or the time to send a crew.

2/ I wonder if the Association has the money to send a
person there? It would cost as much as \$10,000 including
edotimg, titles, etc. This would include some WWII action
shots from a CBS/Walter Cronkite video of the "Air War",
or shots from "Memphis Belle (William Wyler, for the War
Department).

An independent TV Producer here will give me a quick pro-
posal very soon to do the job. Have another friend here
who spent 20 years in the White House as a UPI photographer.
Am sure he can do the work too, but he may not have the time
from his local business.

3/ There surely must be somewhere in the Association who can
do the shooting for himself and the Association. Anyway
to send up a flare?

4/ If shot, and a few action shots from WWII, I believe the
video would sell for a minimum of \$30 each times a thousand
buyers would produce for the Association \$30,000. If the
price was down further, many more could be sold to members
as well as the general public. By the way, "Memphis
Belle" has a shot of the four hangars at Thurleigh.

Dear Russ,

Thanks very much for your letter.

Some day we of the 306th Association will find a way to thank you for your wonderful dedication to the Association. You were the glue that has held us together!!

Regarding my plans and your book, I hope to kick off my plan in about thirty days. I have the two books to start with and hoped to follow it with other aviator books such as yours.

The way my plan works is that I mail to a list of about 500 or 1,000 people who might order a book choice. There are many details I have readied such as envelopes for mailing, a return envelope for placing orders, brochures to sell the books and an address to mail their checks or credit card orders. It is rather complicated. Then I get a bulk mail permit from the Post Office which has a pretty good price tag also. Then when orders are received, I have a book copy house to produce the products in quantities to orders received. Then I have to handle all the other details like postage. Even getting the credit card people lined up and the banks is complicated and rather expensive. It seems that half of the sales will be by credit cards. I have to have a machine in my home office to input the card numbers to see if there is money to pay for the orders.

In line with future plans, I wonder if you have an address for the 8th Air Force Association where I can inquire for a mailing list from them??

And, I would still like Bob Denny's address so I could inquire about his book as a possibility.

So you understand, I need orders for your book before I can place orders for your book...that's how it works OK?

To sum up, I have two books published; one in edit, and four more planned about business and aviation. I treasure your book, and think other aviation and general public people would also. So, we shall see if things work out.

A small aside concerning the local news and the Lincoln bedroom. When we together in England for the 50th, also there were a sister and brother and the sister's husband. I met them for dinner the night of the hangar dance. She and her brother were children of John Chalfant; I gave them an early copy of my "Reflections" book because of her father being in it. Her husband, Ray Scott is a great fishing buddy of George and Barbara Bush. Ray owns a large lake and grounds in Alabama. Anyhow, they spent a night in the Lincoln bedroom as guests of the President.

Again, Russ, let's hope we can advance the cause of military aviation as you have done so well. and let's hope we can peddle a few books sometime in the futuree...

I am enclosing the front and back of a new book by a 306th man, that might fit into your scheme. There is an address on the back cover which may be useful.

Haven't finished the book yet, but have read enough to see that it is well written and interesting.

In rereading your letter, it would seem to me that we ought to enter into some kind of an agreement on the matter of using my book, that we ought to consider what my remuneration would be for furnishing you the material.

Currently my book sells for \$35, and if you are to retail it for that price, or whatever price, my remuneration needs to be somewhere between the sale price and your cost to produce and mail the books.

I have probably been stripped off the roster of the 306th and perhaps understandably so...with my lack of communications.

Thank you very much for your August letter with the copy of my decorations on me you found in the files..really appreciate it so much.

We moved to the Palm Springs Valley in January of 1995...for Maggie's health..and my own..to a drier and warmer climate. My sweet wife of 50 years (Dec 29, 1995) has had a bad run on health since 1992. In October after our Reunion in Bedford, she suffered a strong stroke which could have killed her except for a new medicine under test by the FDA, called TPA (Tissur Primogen Activator) a clot breaker which is very effective if given earlier enough. She talks, walks, cooks, buys and is 90% recovered. Then three months later in the hospital again with a bleeding ulcer...and the third time I mentioned above, plus a fall in mid-December which caused a bone fracture in her left shoulder. She has had it rough and naturally takes much of my time to care for her.


