Conditions were very to confusing to me! The first induction of the fighter plane attack that I had was the suplision of a 20 mm chell under my mavipators table. This at off my inter-com. The bombardier motioned we were under attack. about a minute later he told me we were to bailout - There was fire in cochpit and engineers section.

How and where did you leave plahe?

Bailed out front hatel, Socation - just mortheast of Berlin.

I landed in a tree and climbed down. I evaded the first Did you meet any of your crew mates?

Two or three days later I saw Chiffin and Weymen at Cherusal.

How were you treated, if captured? Owas not mistreated at any time. at stilling first I we were on very short food rations from late Jenuary to May, 1945.
