Clayton R. Meyer, 73, of 2349 Riverside Drive, Beloit, Wis., died Tuesday, March 31, 1998 in Naples Community Hospital, Naples, Fla.

He was born Nov. 7, 1924 in West Bend, Wis., the son of Robert A. and Elizabeth Arts Meyer. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin - Madison in 1949. He was a WWII veteran, serving as 1st Lt. in the 8th Army Air Corps, 306 Bomb Group. His squadron was the first bomb group to fly missions over

Germany. Clayton married Marlene M. Blue in Milwaukee, Wis.

Clayton began his construction career in the 1940s with Kennedy Construction of Beloit. Meyer-Margis Inc. was formed in 1971, and later in 1982, Clayton Meyer Inc., was founded. He was a member of Our Savior's Lutheran Church and a past Council President, V.F.W. Post 2306, Beloit Elks Lodge No. 864, the Beloit Rotary Club, the YMCA, the Beloit Country Club, the Town of Beloit Planning Commission, was Trustee for the Wisconsin Carpenter Fund, and past board member of Beloit Hospital.

Survivors include his wife, Marlene; his sons, David (Dawn) Meyer, and Kevin Meyer, both of Beloit, and Steven (Pamela) Meyer of Ft. Collins, Colo.; his daughter Linda E. (David) Criswell of Portland, Ore.; eight grandchildren, Erin

Meyer, Matthew Meyer, Patrick Meyer, Morgan Meyer, Ivy Ann Meyer, Krystal Meyer, Benjamin Criswell, and Elizabeth Criswell.

He was predeceased by his parents.

Funeral services will be 11 a.m. Monday, April 6, 1998 in Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Beloit, with the Rev. Dr. Eugene Hanson officiating. Burial will be in Baldwin Cemetery with Military Rites. 
