4. Some miscellaneous items.


I have some photos but am afraid few would add anything. I also have the rest of my military file through the pre-306th days but doubt that would be of interest.


Dear Russell:

Sorry to have been so delinquent in replying to your inquiry, but- here it is:

The 8th AF Historical Society contact man for the 398th is G. Hilliard, 7841 Quartermaine Dr., Cincinnati, OH 45236.

He may be of some help.

The best place to start looking for people is at their WWII-period home address, or at least the city.

If this is known, public libraries have many phone books, which may be helpful, or try putting in an information call to a city, costing now about 50¢ each. I sometimes, when I find no such person listed, ask for two or three numbers of people with the same last name. This has often bore fruit.

I did have a contact within the VA, but he has now retired. If anyone has been a POW, I would write the VA in Washington and ask for help. They are quite tuned in to POWs now. A congressman might also be of some help in this.

Public libraries, city or town clerks, or newspaper editors may be helpful. With the 306th, a number of inquiries sent to weekly newspaper editors have been published, and often someone knows where to make a contact.

I hope this can be of some help to you.



Dear Russell:

After sending you my letter on June 10, 1981, I came across a couple of other things that might be of interest to let you know how the 306th closed out the war.

The last full group bombing raid that I remember the 369th Squadron going on was May 19, 1945 which was a horrible raid over Falkenburg, a rail center south of Berlin where one of the major east-west German railroad lines crossed. My memory is that Captain Bill Haas received a Silver Star for leading the mission which was required to go over the target about four times due to extremely heavy anti-aircraft fire.

After May 19th and before my flying record picks up again on May 3rd, I remember flying numerous leaflet sorties over both French and German territory. Since this closed out the war for the group perhaps my reminiscences might be of interest to you:

a. I remember the leaflet bombs were hexagonal wood "orange crates" with a barometric exploding device. Over Lubeck, Germany, I dropped a load of these. When the atmospheric device opened too soon, I watched 90% of our leaflets fall into the canal and this after such a long journey.

b. I remember checking the strength of the anticipated anti-aircraft over St. Nazaire and Lorient, France. Since we were flying the leaflet mission alone, we took the B-17 up to 31,000 feet for our drop. The mission was uneventful except for the beautiful view of the coast lines of northern Europe, Ireland, and Great Britain laid out in front of us like a map as we let down heading back home. This was as high as I had been.

c. Probably the most memorable leaflet raid was one in which we participated shortly after the opening of Buchenwald

by our troops. We dropped not only leaflets but some small food parcels over this huge camp and spent considerable time after the drop viewing, among other things, the civilians digging up the mass graves and preparing individual burial plots to the south of the camp. There were still many residents in the camp of all nationalities who by that time had put up their own flags and gave us many friendly waves.

d. I am enclosing a photocopy of the leaflet we dropped on May 8th. As we came back from dropping this we heard Churchill announcing the end of the war and arrived back at the base to gunfire as the celebration had already began. Some of the personnel were firing arms. I have several other of these leaflets including one that announces that Hitler is dead. If you want to borrow the actual leaflets for any purpose, let me know and I will send them.


e. I also found my "passport" photo which we carried on missions to be used in the event we were shot down and needed identification papers. I am not sending that as I do not know if it would be of any interest.

f. I am enclosing the cover of our language folder including a page listing German and Spanish phrases. The pamphlet had four different languages.

g. I am enclosing a citation for the Air Medal which illustrates the language used at the end of the war for those of us who flew six combat missions. I send this to you for the use of the language and not for the use of my citation as this was my only award and is nothing compared with the Distinguished Flying Crosses, Silver Stars, and Distinguish Service Crosses which were earned by others present in the group.

I think this is about all I have that will be of interest. If I find something else I will send it on. If you are looking for anything in particular, let me know and I'll see if I can come across it. With my continued best wishes for success, I am,

London, May 8

RUSSIANS TAKE BRESLAU IN FINAL HOURS OF WAR

BEFORE unconditional surrender reports were circulated last night, communiqués and frontline dispatches reported fighting progress as follows:

Soviet troops captured the town and fortress of Breslau after a siege of three months. More than 40,000 Germans, including General von Nikols, were taken prisoner.

U.S. 3rd Army troops, after occupying Linz and Pilsen, moved forward to enter Brez, 50 miles southwest of Prague. Other troops reached the area of Susic, 23 miles northeast of Regen.

West and south of Pilsen American troops reached Tschernoschin and Bischofteinitz and freed Stribrd and Klattau. To the northwest they reached the vicinity of Matersgrun and entered Wesenau.

Latest Soviet communiqués said

SEVEN DAYS OF VICTORY

APRIL 30: In Berlin the Russians occupy the Reichstag; Americans complete the occupation of Munich.

MAY 1: Hitler's death announced on the German radio; Admiral Doenitz declared his successor.

MAY 2: The fall of Berlin; unconditional surrender of the German and Italian Fascist armed forces in Italy, amounting to nearly 1,000,000 men.

MAY 3: Hamburg surrenders.

MAY 4: Unconditional surrender of the German armies in Holland, Denmark and North-west Germany.

MAY 5: Unconditional surrender of the 1st and 19th German armies in the Munich area.

MAY 6: Fighting only in Czechoslovakia and the Baltic area. Russians capture Ruegen.

Russian troops were fighting in the approaches to Olomouc; only 22 miles north of the Second Ukrainian forces which Sunday occupied Kojetin, wiping out two German infantry battalions.

On the southern front, French troops occupied Bludenz on the Innsbruck - Feldkirch railway. Other French forces reached Arlberg pass, western gateway to Austria.

Eighth and Fifth army forces, following their drive from Italy, reached the Villach area, 25 miles west of Klagenfurt.

Yugoslav forces crossed the Austrian border into Carinthia and were fighting for Klagenfurt. Other units moved along the Slovene coast, liberating 350 political prisoners and taking Gorizia.

Germans still fighting in Czechoslovakia have placed themselves beyond the law and will be dealt with as saboteurs, Hubert Ripka, Czechoslovak minister of foreign trade, said in London, after the general capitulation announced by Count Schwerin von Krosigk, new German foreign minister.

U.S. FOOD OUTPUT WILL NOT SLACKEN

There will be no let-up in America's intensive food production program because of V-E day, U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Wickard said in Washington. He added that food would be required for the forces of the Allies who still have the job of beating the Japanese, and that Americans would be called upon to share in the feeding of the suffering peoples of the liberated areas.

FREED BY RUMANIA

The Rumanian Ministry of the Interior has ordered the discharge of 1,283 persons from concentration camps where they had been interned under the Fascist régime, Moscow radio reported yesterday.

THIS is Victory-in-Europe Day.

In accordance with arrangements between the three great powers, an official announcement will be broadcast at 13 00 GMT this afternoon.

News of the unconditional surrender of all German armed forces to all of the Allies was first announced to the German people over the Flensburg radio.

The new German foreign minister, Count Schwerin von Krosigk, announced that the German High Command, on Admiral Doenitz's orders, had decided to give up the fight.

"To continue the war," Krosigk declared, "would only mean senseless and futile disintegration."

"This five year fight, from the start of the conflict, the war has had no end."

There was no official S.H.A.E.F. announcement, but correspondents reported that the surrender took place at 00 41 GMT Monday in the French school building at Rheims where General Eisenhower has his advance headquarters.

Correspondents said that Gen. Alfred Jodl signed the unconditional surrender document for Germany, Gen. Bedell Smith for the United States and Great Britain, Gen. Ivan Susloparoff for Russia and Gen. François Sevez for France. They reported that General Eisenhower was not present but later received Gen. Smith and German Admiral Von Friedeberg.

The British Ministry of Information announced last night that today will be treated as "Victory-in-Europe Day" and will be regarded along with Wednesday as a holiday. It said that "in accordance with arrangements between the three great powers, an official

announcement will be broadcast by the Prime Minister at 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon" and that King George VI will broadcast to the Empire and Commonwealth at 9 o'clock tonight.

EX-PRISONERS, LEAVE THE ROADS CLEAR!

GENERAL EISENHOWER, Supreme Commander, Allied Expeditionary Force, issuing instructions to all liberated prisoners of war and displaced persons in Germany, again stressed that the final military operations in Germany, including the movement of Allied armies to their respective zones, must have the highest priority.

"Disorders and interferences with military traffic on main roads will result in delay and retard the day when the Allied military authorities can arrange for your repatriation," General Eisenhower stated.

FRIEDEN

DOENITZ KAPITULIERT

London, 8 Mai

DER Tag des Sieges in Europa ist da.

In Übereinstimmung mit den zwischen den drei Grossmächten getroffenen Vereinbarungen wird das Ende des Krieges in Europa heute nachmittag um 15 Uhr über den Rundfunk offiziell verkündet werden.

Die Nachricht von der bedingungslosen Kapitulation aller deutschen Streitkräfte gegenüber allen alliierten Mächten wurde zuerst über Radio Flensburg dem deutschen Volk bekannt gegeben.

PRAG VOR DER BEFREIUNG — BRESLAU FÄLLT

Vor der Nachricht über die bedingungslose Kapitulation der deutschen Streitkräfte gegenüber den alliierten Mächten.

Nach einer dreimonatigen Besetzung der Stadt Breslau durch die deutsche Wehrmacht, wurden mehr als 40 000 Mann, einschliesslich des Kampfkommandanten General v. Nikols, gefangen genommen.

Verbände der 3. USA-Armee stiessen nach der Besetzung von Linz und Pilsen weiter vor und drangen in Brez, 30 km südwestlich von Prag, ein. Andere amerikanische Verbände erreichten den Ort um von Susic, 37 km nordöstlich von Regau.

Im Westen und Süden von Pilsen erreichten amerikanische Truppen Tschernoschin und Bischofteinitz, Stribrod und Klattau wurden befreit. Im Nordwesten stehen die Amerikaner in der Nähe von Maiersgrun und drangen in Wesenau ein.

Letzte Sowjet-Meldungen sprechen von Kämpfen russischer Truppen um die Zugänge nach Olomouc, wo sie nur noch 27 km von der 2. Ukrainischen Armee entfernt stehen, die am Sonntag Kojetin unter Vernichtung zweier deutscher Infanterie-Bataillone besetzte.

An der Süd-Front haben französische Truppen Bludenz an der Eisenbahnstrecke Innsbruck-Feldkirch besetzt. Andere französische Verbände erreichten den Arlberg-Pass.

Einheiten der 8. und 5. Armee, die ihren Vormarsch von Italien aus weiter fortsetzten, erreichten den Raum von Villach, 40 km westlich Klagenfurt.

Der neue Aussenminister des Reiches, Graf Schwerin von Krosigk, erklärte, dass das Oberkommando der Wehrmacht auf Befehl von Grossadmiral Doenitz die Einstellung des Kampfes angeordnet habe.

„Eine Fortführung des Krieges“, so stellte Schwerin von Krosigk fest, „würde nur sinnloses Blutvergiessen und unnötige Zerstörung bedeuten“.

Fünf Jahre, acht Monate und fünf Tage nach seinem Ausbruch hat der Krieg in Europa nun sein Ende gefunden.

Bis jetzt ist eine offizielle Ankündigung des Alliierten Oberkommandos noch nicht erfolgt. Berichterstatter melden jedoch, dass der Vollzug der bedingungslosen Kapitulation von Deutschland am Montag früh 2.41 Uhr in einem Schulgebäude in Reims stattfand, wo sich das vorgeschobene Hauptquartier von General Eisenhower befindet.

Nach Berichten der Korrespondenten haben das Dokument über die bedingungslose Kapitulation Generaloberst Jodl für Deutschland, General Bedell Smith für die USA und Grossbritannien, General Iwan Susloparoff für die Sowjet-Union und General Fran-

cois-devez für Frankreich unterzeichnet. Wie noch berichtet wird, hat General Eisenhower dem Unterzeichnungsakt nicht beigewohnt, jedoch später General Smith und den deutschen Admiral v. Friedberg empfangen.

Das britische Informationsministerium kündigte gestern Nacht an, dass der heutige Tag als „Tag des Sieges in Europa“ und zusammen mit dem morgigen Mittwoch als Feiertag gilt. Das Informationsministerium gab weiter bekannt, dass entsprechend den Abmachungen zwischen den drei Grossmächten der englische Ministerpräsident am Dienstag um 15 Uhr eine offizielle Erklärung über den Rundfunk abgeben und König Georg VI. am gleichen Tag um 21 Uhr zum gesamten englischen Weltreich sprechen wird.

MORDBEFehl HIMMLERS

Ein Befehl Heinrich Himmlers, dass die Insassen des Konzentrationslagers Dachau den Alliierten unter keinen Umständen noch lebend in die Hände fallen dürfen, wurde jetzt aufgefunden. Bekanntlich wurden die 33 000 Häftlinge des KZ Buchenwald durch amerikanische Truppen befreit.

DISZIPLIN BESCHLEUNIGT DIE HEIMKEHR

GENERAL EISENHOWER, der Oberbefehlshaber der alliierten Streitkräfte, hat folgende Anweisungen erlassen an alle befreiten Kriegsgefangenen, Fremdarbeiter und zwangsverschickten Personen:

1. Bleibt an Ort und Stelle. Wartet Befehle ab.
2. Bildet kleine Gruppen Eurer Nationalität und wählt Führer.
3. Weg von den Durchgangsstrassen.
4. Verhütet Zerstörung von Werkanlagen, Vernichtung amtlicher Dokumente, vermeidet Unordnung, Plünderung und Sabotage, die nach den militärischen Gesetzen bestraft werden.

Das Oberkommando gibt Euch weiter bekannt, dass das Tempo der Heimsendung für die einzelnen Nationalitäten verschieden sein wird. Die Angehörigen von Westeuropa, Engländer, Franzosen, Belgier, Holländer und Luxemburger, können schneller rückgeführt werden als die Angehörigen von Ost- und Südost-Europa.

Das Oberkommando macht also die befreiten Russen, Polen, Tschechen, Jugoslawen und Griechen darauf aufmerksam, dass sie in ihren Versammlungsräumen länger bleiben können als die Angehörigen der westlichen Nationen, und dass die Schnelligkeit, mit der ihre Rückführung in ihre Heimat durchgeführt werden kann, von ihrer Disziplin und der Befolgung der Befehle abhängt.

Das Oberkommando gibt folgende Spezialanweisungen für alle russischen Staatsangehörigen:

Alle Russen, die sich in den vom Oberkommando kontrollierten Gebieten befinden, werden so schnell wie möglich zu den russischen Behörden gebracht werden.

Für die polnischen Staatsangehörigen gelten folgende Sonderanweisungen:

Befreite Polen, die sich in den Gebieten Deutschlands befinden, die vom Alliierten Oberkommando kontrolliert werden, haben Gelegenheit, ihre Wünsche zu äussern, ob sie nach Polen zurückkehren wollen oder nicht. Jeder Fall wird individuell behandelt werden.

GENERAL Eisenhower, Dowódca Naczelny Sił Sojuszniczych wystosował poniższe nowe instrukcje do wszystkich oswobodzonych jeńców wojennych oraz osób przesiedlonych w Niemczech:
Zdobycie prawie całych Niemiec oraz pokonanie armii niemieckich pociągnęło za sobą oswobodzenie milionów jeńców, osób przesiedlonych oraz robotników.

Celem zapewnienia im bytu oraz uskutecznienia szybkiej repatriacji należy zachować porządek i dyscyplinę.

Ostateczne operacje wojskowe w Niemczech oraz przeniesienie armii sojuszniczych do odpowiednich okręgów mają pierwszeństwo. Nielad na głównych szosach gdzie odbywa się transport wojskowy spowoduje opóźnienie chwili, w której sojusznicze władze wojskowe zajmą się waszą repatriacją.

Dlatego też przestrzegacie i nadal poniższych instrukcji:

1. Pozostańcie na miejscu. Czekajcie na rozkazy.

2. Twórzcie niewielkie oddziały tejsamej narodowości i wybierajcie przywódców, którzy w waszym imieniu będą pertraktować z wojskowymi władzami sojuszniczymi.

3. Główne szosy i drogi muszą pozostać wolne dla transportu wojskowego.

4. Zapobiegajcie zniszczeniu urzędów biurowych, i dokumentów. Unikajcie nieładu, grabieży i sabotażu, które będą karane według prawa wojennego.

Instrukcje te odnoszą się do wszystkich.

Naczelny Dowódca donosi wam też, że przyspieszenie repatriacji zależy będzie od narodowości poszczególnego obywatela. Narody

zachodniej Europy, jak Brytyjczycy, Francuzi, Belgijczycy, Holendrzy oraz mieszkańcy Luxemburga mogą być szybciej repatriowane niż narody ze wschodu oraz południowo wschodniej Europy.

Naczelny Dowódca zawiadamia zatem oswobodzonych Rosjan, Polaków, Czechów, Jugosławów i Greków, że oni wszyscy może nieco dłużej przebywać będą w punktach zbiorczych niż narody z zachodu. Przyspieszenie ich repatriacji zależy będzie zatem od zachowania dyscypliny i posłuszeństwa.

Naczelny Dowódca skierował specjalny apel do wszystkich Rosjan:

Wszyscy na terytorium pod kontrolą Naczelnego Dowódcy oswobodzeni Rosjanie zostaną skierowani do władz rosyjskich jak najszybciej.

SOJUSZNICZY ZWALCZAJĄ RESZTKI OPORU

PPRZED ogłoszeniem bezwarunkowej kapitulacji wczoraj w nocy poczyniono według doniesień z frontu następujące postępy:
Wojska sowieckie zajęły twierdzą we Wrocławiu po oblężeniu przez trzy miesiące. Ponad 40,000 Niemców wzięto do niewolimy króćmi znajdował się generał von Nikols.

Wojska 3. Armii, po zajęciu Linu i Pilzna wkroczyły do Brez, 80 km na południowy zachód od Pragi. Inne wojska osiągnęły terytorium Susic 37 km na północny wschód od Regen.

Na zachód i południe od Pilzna wojska amerykańskie osiągnęły

Tschernoschin i Bischofteinitz i oyczyli z nieprzyjaciela Strubrd i Klattau. Na północny zachód osiągnęły one okolicę Maiersgrun i wkroczyły do Wesenau.

Ostatnie komunikaty sowieckie doniosły, że wojska rosyjskie walczyły w pobliżu Olomuńca, 27 km na północ od Drugiej Armii Ukraińskiej, która zajęła w niedzielę Kojetin.

Na południowym froncie wojska francuskie zajęły Bludenz na linii kolejowej Innsbruck — Feldkirch. Inne wojska francuskie osiągnęły Arlberg.

Osma i Piata armje posuwając się z Włoch osiągnęły obszar

Villach, 40 km na zachód od Celowa.

Wojska jugoslawskie przekroczyły granicę austriacką i wkroczyły do Karyntji. Walczą one koło Celowa. Inne jednostki posunęły się wzdłuż wybrzeża słoweńskiego.

Niemcy, którzy ciągle jeszcze walczą w Czechosłowacji pogwałcili prawo — oświadczył w Londynie Hubert Ripka, minister handlu zagranicznego Czechosłowacji i będą traktowani ze względu na ogólną kapitulację ogłoszoną przez Księcia Schwerin von Krosigk, nowo nominowanego ministra spraw zagranicznych Niemiec, jako winni sabotażu.

OTO dzień zwycięstwa w Europie.

Stosownie do umowy trzech wielkich mocarstw rządowe oznajmienie będzie ogłoszone przez rozgłośnie o godzinie 3 popołudnia.

Rozgłośnia w Flensburg ogłosiła po raz pierwszy narodowi niemieckiemu, że wszystkie wojska niemieckie kapitulowały bezwarunkowo.

Książę Schwerin von Krosigk, nowo mianowany minister dla spraw zagranicznych w Niemczech ogłosił, że Naczelne Dowództwo Niemieckie wzięło decyzję zaprzestania walki z rozkazem admirała Doenitza.

„Przedłużanie wojny, powiedział Krosigk, nałoby się dalszemu bezcelowemu przelewu krwi.”

W pięć lat, osiem miesięcy i sześć dni rozpoczęciu konfliktu europejskiego, wojna w Europie ustała.

Dotychczas nie było urzędowego oświadczenia S.H.A.E.F. u lecz według doniesień ze strony korespondentów kapitulacja odbyła się w poniedziałek o godzinie 2.41 rano we francuskim budynku szkolnym w Rheims gdzie generał Eisenhower ustalili główną kwaterę w okresie postępów sojuszniczych.

Korespondenci donoszą,

że generał Alfred Jodl podpisał bezwarunkową kapitulację ze strony niemieckiej. Ze strony Stanów Zjednoczonych i Wielkiej Brytanii spełniał funkcję generał Eisenhower, ze strony Rosji generał Ivan Susloparoff a generał Francois Sevez ze strony francuskiej. Korespondenci donoszą też, że generał Eisenhower nie był obecny przy podpisaniu kapitulacji.

Brytyjskie Ministerstwo Informacji ogłosiło ubiegłą wieczora że dzień dzisiejszy uważany będzie za „Dzień Zwycięstwa w Europie” i stanowić będzie wraz z środą dzień świąteczny.

Oswobodzeni na terytorium niemieckim będą mieli sposobność oświadczenia, czy chcą powrócić do Polski czy nie. Decyzja zapadnie indywidualnie. **EISENHOWER**

VIVE LA PAIX!

L'ALLEMAGNE A CAPITULE

Londres, le 8 mai

C'EST aujourd'hui Jour de Victoire en Europe.

Conformément aux dispositions prises de concert par les trois grands alliés, une annonce officielle doit être faite au micro cet après-midi à 13h. G.M.T.

C'est la Radio de Flensburg qui, la première, a donné aux Allemands la nouvelle de la reddition inconditionnelle, à l'ensemble des Alliés, de toutes les forces armées allemandes.

Le comte Schwerin von Krosigk, nouveau ministre allemand des Affaires

EISENHOWER S'ADRESSE AUX LIBERES

VOICI le texte des nouvelles instructions données hier par le général Eisenhower, Commandant Suprême des Forces Expéditionnaires, à tous les prisonniers de guerre et déportés libérés en Allemagne: "Conquête, par les armées alliées, de l'Ouest et de l'Est, de la quasi-totalité de l'Allemagne, ainsi que la désagrégation des armées allemandes, conséquence de la reddition inconditionnelle de millions de prisonniers de guerre, de déportés et de travailleurs des Nations Unies, ont permis de pourvoir à leur bien-être et d'organiser leur rapatriement de façon ordonnée, il est essentiel que soient maintenus l'ordre et la discipline.

Les dernières opérations militaires en Allemagne, qui comprennent le mouvement des armées alliées vers leurs zones respectives, auront le pas sur toute autre chose. Tout désordre, ainsi que toute obstruction de la circulation militaire sur les grandes artères, auraient pour résultat de retarder le jour où il sera possible aux autorités militaires de procéder à votre rapatriement.

Les consignes fondamentales que devront suivre tous les prisonniers et déportés libérés demeurent par conséquent les suivantes:

1. Ne vous déplacez pas hors de votre région. Attendez vos ordres.
2. Formez-vous en petits groupes de même nationalité et élisez des chefs qui auront pour mission de vous représenter auprès des autorités militaires alliées.
3. Ecarter-vous des grandes artères servant à la circulation militaire.
4. Evitez la destruction de tout outillage et de tous documents officiels, ainsi que tout désordre, pillage et sabotage, lesquels seront punis selon la loi militaire.

Ces instructions s'adressent à vous tous.

Le Commandant Suprême tient également à vous informer qu'il y aura une différence dans le rythme du rapatriement en ce qui concerne les nationaux des différents pays. Les ressortissants des pays de l'Europe occidentale, Britanniques, Français, Belges, Hollandais, Luxembourgeois, peuvent être rapatriés plus vite que les personnes originaires de l'Est et du Sud-Est de l'Europe.

Le Commandant Suprême Allié avise par conséquent les Russes, Polonais, Tchécoslovaques, Yougoslaves et Grecs libérés, qu'ils auront peut-être à demeurer dans les centres de triage plus longtemps que les ressortissants des pays de l'Ouest, et que la rapidité avec laquelle il sera possible d'organiser leur rapatriement dépendra de leur discipline et de leur obéissance.

Le Commandant Suprême adresse aux citoyens soviétiques le message spécial suivant:

Tous les citoyens soviétiques libérés à l'intérieur de la zone contrôlée par le Commandant Suprême seront transférés dès qu'il sera possible de le faire, dans la zone se trouvant sous la juridiction des autorités soviétiques.

Avis aux déportés libérés:

D E M E U R E Z

en attendant que s'organise le retour

Etrangères, a déclaré que le Haut Commandement allemand avait, sur l'ordre de l'amiral Doenitz, décidé d'abandonner la lutte.

"Continuer la guerre, a déclaré Krosigk, signifierait seulement prolonger une vaine effusion de sang."

Voici donc la guerre en Europe terminée, cinq ans, huit mois et cinq jours après le commencement du conflit.

Le Haut Commandement Allié n'a fait à ce sujet aucune déclaration officielle, mais on sait par les correspondants de guerre que la reddition a eu lieu dans la nuit du dimanche au lundi, à 24h41 GMT, dans une école de Reims où le général Eisenhower a établi son QG avancé.

Selon les correspondants, l'acte de reddition inconditionnelle de l'Allemagne a été signé par le général Alfred Jodl pour cette dernière, le général Bedell Smith pour les Etats-Unis et la Grande-Bretagne, le général Ivan Susloparoff pour l'URSS, et le général François Sevez pour la France. Le général Eisenhower n'aurait pas été présent à la signature, mais aurait plus tard reçu le général Smith et l'amiral allemand von Friedeberg.

Le ministère britannique de l'Information a annoncé hier soir, que la journée d'aujourd'hui serait proclamée "Jour de Victoire en Europe" et considérée, au même titre que le lendemain, mercredi, comme jour de fête officielle. Il a ajouté que "conformément aux dispositions prises de concert par les trois grandes puissances, une annonce officielle sera faite au micro par le Premier Ministre mardi à 3h de l'après-midi", et que le roi Georges VI s'adressera par radio à l'Empire britannique ce soir à 9 heures.

DERNIERS SOUBRESAITS DU NAZISME

VOICI comment les derniers communiqués et dépêches du front, antérieurs à l'annonce de la reddition inconditionnelle de toutes les forces allemandes en Europe, décrivait la situation militaire:

Après un siège de trois mois, les troupes soviétiques se sont emparées de la ville et de la citadelle de Breslau. Plus de 40.000 Allemands, y compris le général von Nikols, ont été faits prisonniers. Les troupes de la 3ème Armée américaine, après avoir occupé Linz et Pilsen, se sont portées en avant et sont entrées à Brez, à 80 km. au sud-ouest de Prague. D'autres troupes ont atteint la région de Susic à 37 km. au nord-est de Regen.

A l'ouest et au sud de Pilsen, les troupes américaines ont atteint Tschernoschin et Bischofteinitz, et libéré Stribrd et Klattau. Au nord-ouest, elles ont atteint les parages de Maiergrun et sont entrées à Wesenau.

Selon les derniers communiqués soviétiques, les troupes russes combattaient aux abords d'Olmütz, à 27 km. seulement au nord de la 2ème Armée ukrainienne, qui avait occupé Kojetin dimanche, balayant complètement deux bataillons d'infanterie allemande.

Sur le front Sud, les troupes françaises ont occupé Bludenz sur la ligne d'Innsbruck à Feldkirch. D'autres troupes françaises ont atteint le col de l'Arlberg, porte occidentale de l'Autriche.

Poursuivant leur poussée depuis l'Italie, les troupes des 5ème et 8ème Armées alliées ont atteint la région de Villach à 40 km. à l'ouest de Klagenfurt.

Franchissant la frontière autrichienne, des forces yougoslaves ont pénétré en Carinthie et combattent pour la possession de Klagenfurt. D'autres unités ont avancé le long de la côte slovène, libérant 350 prisonniers politiques et s'emparant de Gorizia.

M. Hubert Ripka, ministre du Commerce Extérieur de Tchécoslovaquie, actuellement à Londres a déclaré que les Allemands qui continuent à combattre en Tchécoslovaquie se sont placés hors la loi et seront traités comme des franc-tireurs.



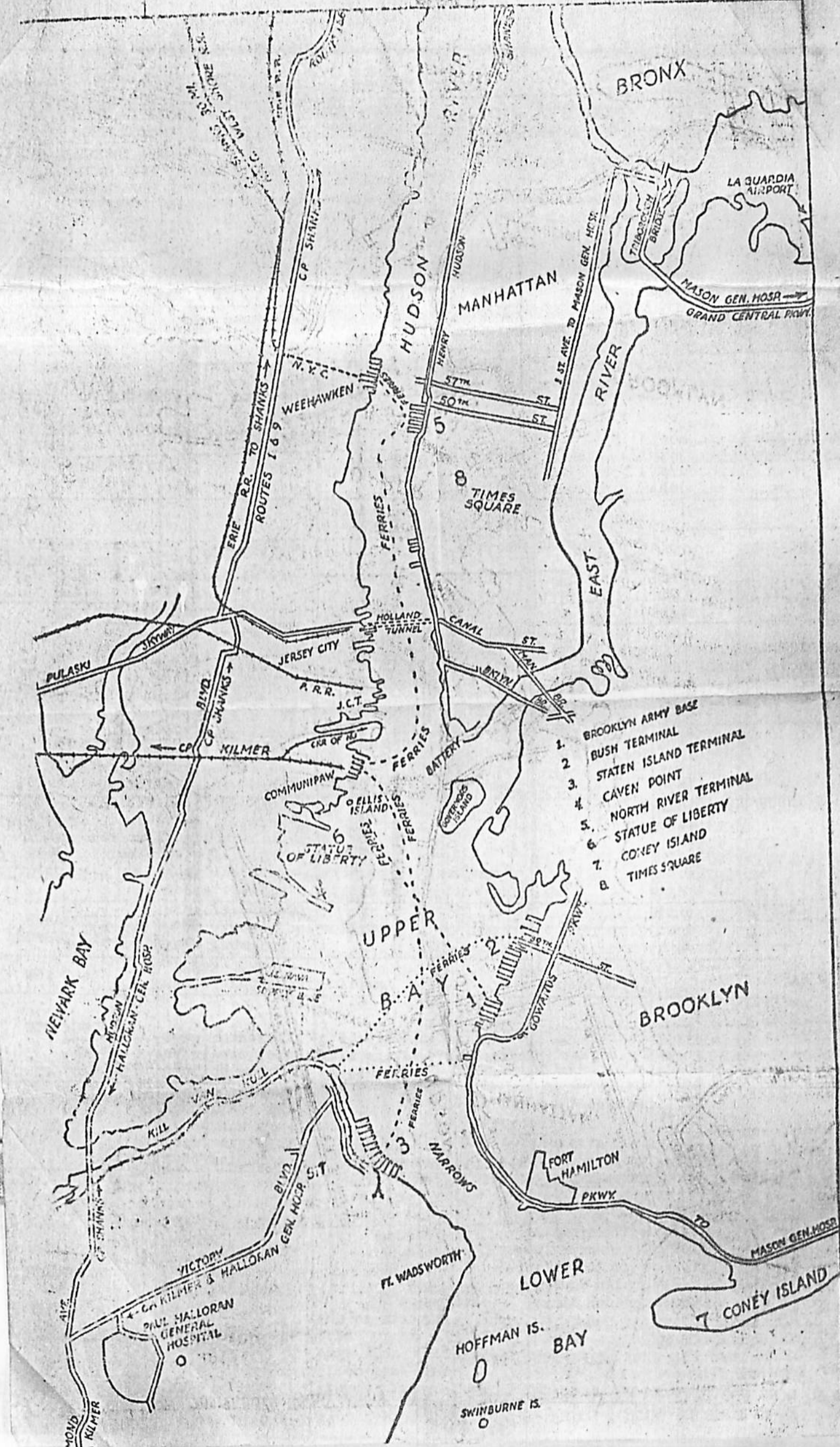
